George W. E. Nickelsburg and James C. VanderKam, 1 Enoch 2. Hermeneia. Minneapolis: Fortress Press (www.fortresspress.com), 2012. Pages, xxx + 618. Cloth, \$82.00.

This volume completes a monumental commentary on 1 Enoch, an event worth celebrating. Volume 1 (2001) dealt with chapters 1–36 and 81–108. Nickelsburg wrote the commentary on the Parables of Enoch (chaps. 37–71), which he dates to the turn of the era (p. 3), and VanderKam on the Book of Luminaries, chapters 72–82 (pp. 333–569), which he dates some time between the final edition of P and 160 B.C.E. (the date of Jubilees): see p. 345. The translation, a revision of Nickelsburg's 1 Enoch: A New Translation (2004), will be published separately in the near future. One can hardly find two people in the whole world as qualified for this task as Nickelsburg and VanderKam, to whom the entire scholarly world is grateful.
