Contributors

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Gerhard Forde (1927–2005) was at the time of his death Professor of Systematic Theology at Luther Seminary. He was the author of many books on the Protestant Reformation, its theology, and its implications for contemporary life. Active in ecumenical circles, he served for many years on the Lutheran-Roman Catholic dialogue.

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Ernst Käsemann (1906–1998) was professor of New Testament at the German universities of Mainz, Göttingen, and Tübingen. Active in the Confessing Church, which opposed Hitler, Käsemann was imprisoned by the Gestapo

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Letty M. Russell (1929–2007) was professor of theology at Yale Divinity School, New Haven, Connecticut. Russell published widely in the areas of ecclesiology and human liberation. In 1999 a festschrift was published in Russell's honor, titled *Liberating Eschatology*.

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
